In 2009, Erik Hulber (Radosys, Hungary) proposed at the HPA International Workshop on Quality Assurance in Radon Measurements in Chilton (UK) to found a similar association to AARST in Europe (\rightarrow European Association of Radon Professionals EARP)

Foundation of the European Radon Association (ERA) on 28 May 2013 in Bouillon (Belgium)
